NOTES FROM THE MEETING:

1.Matters arising:

2. Welfare:

No issues have been brought to the attention of the committee apart from the suggestion of providing a first aid kit in the indoor range. Action WK

3.Finance:

Club membership subscriptions now stand at 197 fully paid-up members. 184 members have renewed their insurance. No further report.

4. Scores and Records:

5. Competitions:

MAJOR PROJECTS: (in order of priority)

- 1. Soil and turf to be laid adjacent retaining system to field side of indoor range. (Spring 2023)
- 2. Hardstanding in front of entrance doors to indoor range.
- 3. Car parking provision between pavilion and boundary wall
- 4. Tarmacking of existing car park area and marking out spaces.

MINOR PROJECTS: (in order of priority)

- 1. Fix a ply panel in the indoor range to support 2 screens.
- 2. Apply a clear sealer to the concrete floor of the indoor range
- 3. Replace door to meter chamber
- 4. Install dummy CCTV cameras
