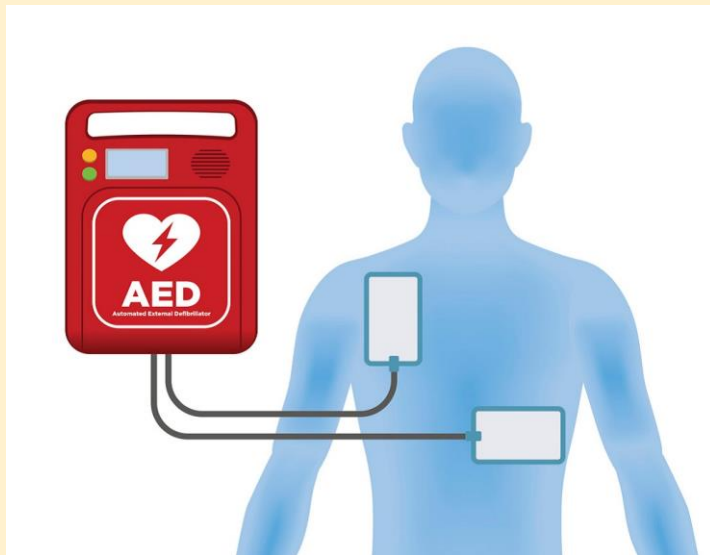
President's Report

Our current defib is 6 years old and the battery is waning. The cost of a new battery is very nearly the cost of a New Defib. We are asking for donations however small to help fund the cost of a new life saving Defibrillator.

If a someone suffers an out of hospital cardiac arrest, their survival rate is less than 10%.
With the quick use of a defibrillator this rises to between 50% and 70%

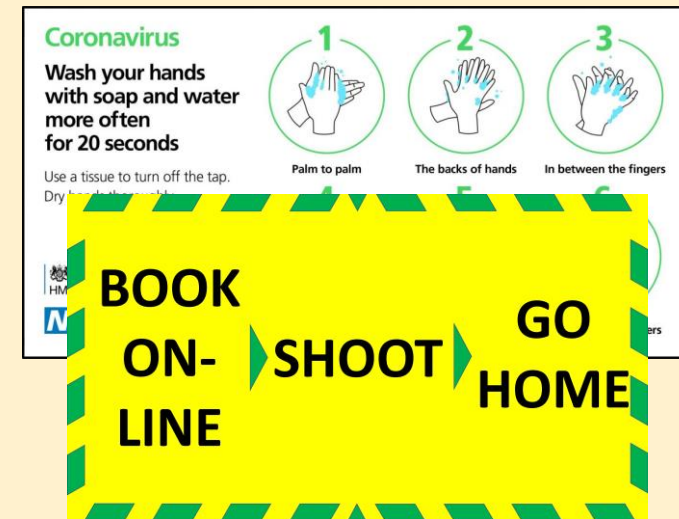

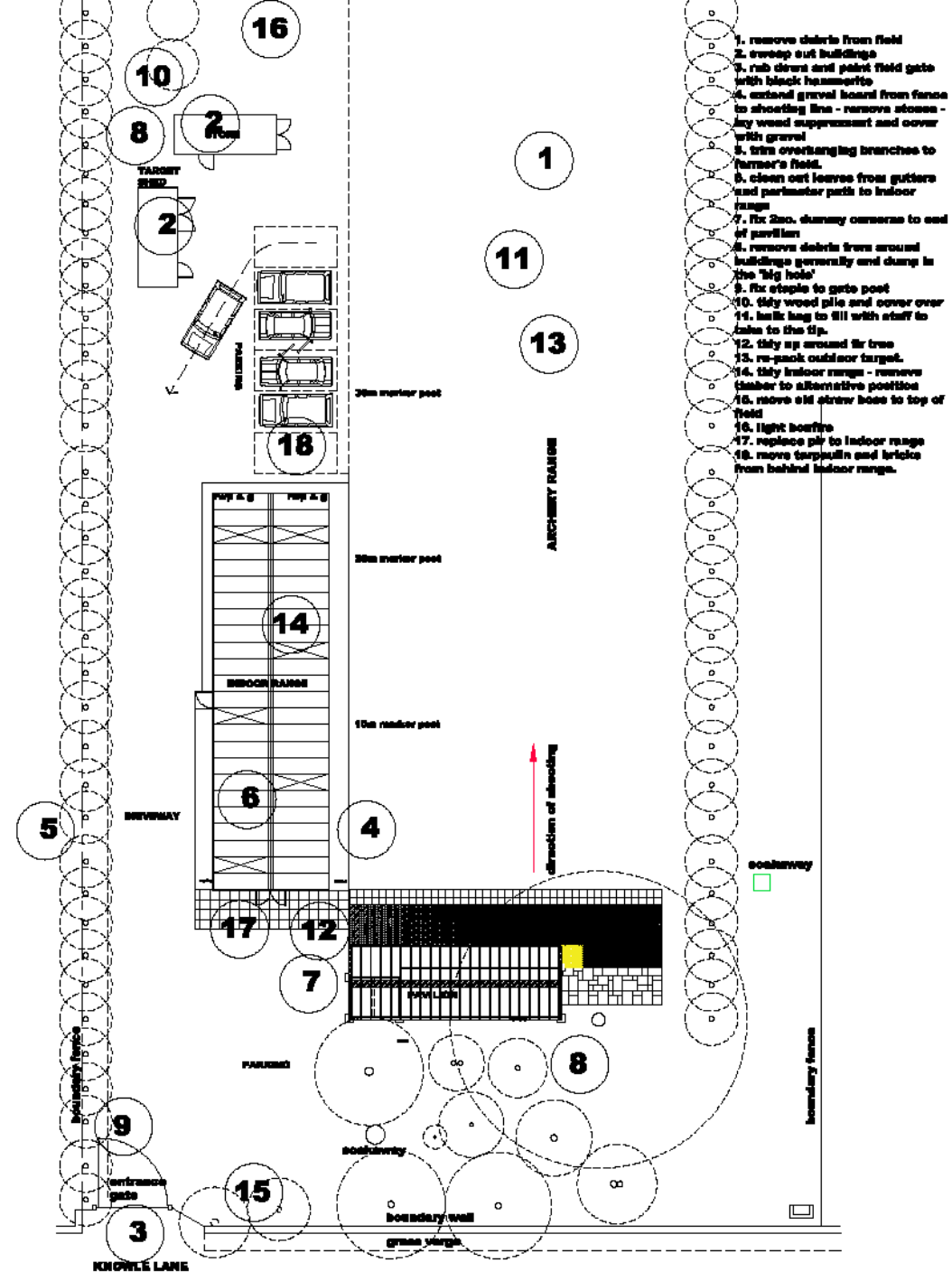

Field tidy jobs:

1. Remove debris from field
2. Sweep out buildings
3. Rub down and paint field gate with black Hammerite.
4. Extend gravel board from fence to shooting line – remove stones – lay weed suppressant and cover with gravel.
5. Clear trimmed branches from farmers field.
6. Clear leaves from gutters & perimeter path around indoor range.
7. Fix 2 dummy camera to end of pavilion.
8. Remove debris generally around buildings and dump in “big hole”.
9. Fix staple to gate post.
10. Tidy wood pile and cover over.
11. Bulk bag to fill with stuff to take to tip.
12. Tidy up around fir tree.
13. Re-pack outdoor targets.
14. Tidy indoor range – remove timber to alternative position.
15. Move old straw boss to top of field.
16. Light bonfire after risk assessment done.
17. Replace PIR to indoor range.
18. Move tarpaulin and bricks from behind indoor range.

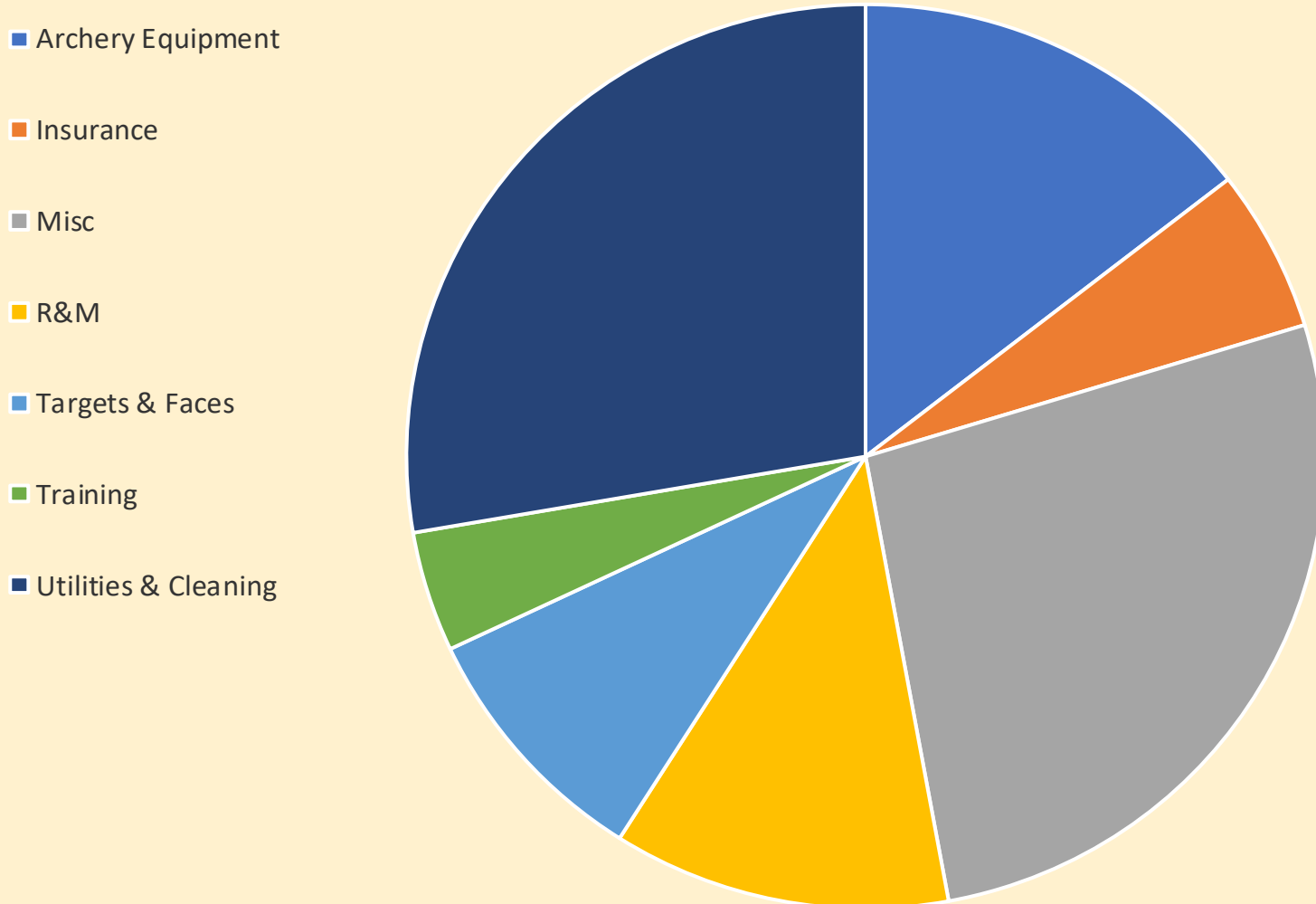

Junior Liaison Officer's Report

- Started the year with 22 Juniors.
 - 4 didn't renew AGB subs in October.

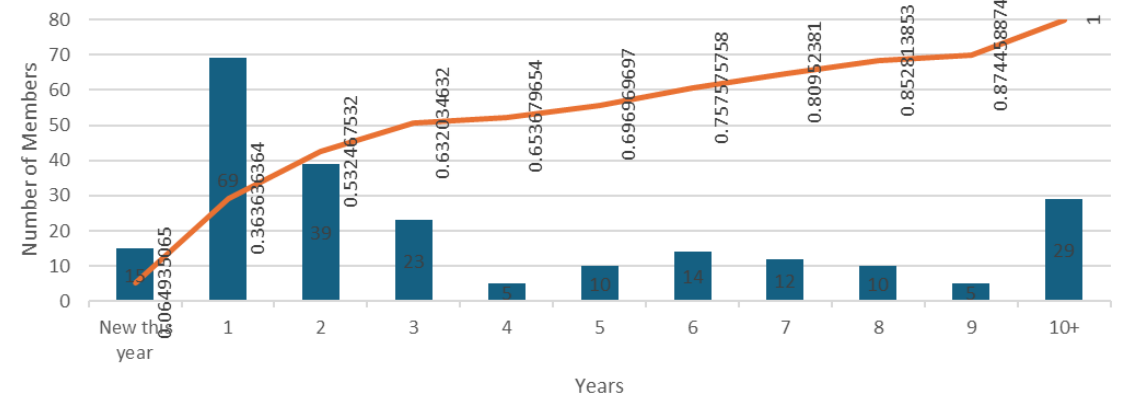
- ☺ Another coach/volunteer workshop held this year and the Club Coaching Development Plan was updated.

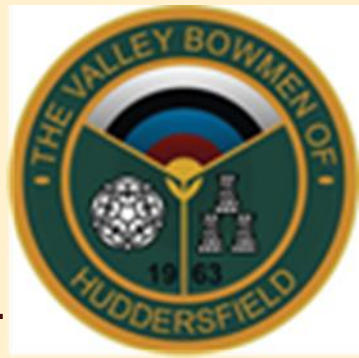
- a. A glaring omission that it requires a quorum of 50% of fully paid up members required to authorise changes to the Constitution.
