Clout Competition - Sunday 28th September 2025

Although the field set up proceeded without a hitch, the first practice afternoon was a compete washout with the first substantial downpour of the summer cancelling the session before it even started.



The second practice afternoon, although very overcast remained dry for the dozen or so archers that took to the field. Initially the strong head wind was proving a challenge and it took several ends before most archers were getting the distance. We ended the day shooting at Jean Pierre, or should we say we ended the day looking for a lost compound arrow having shot (and missed) Jean Pierre.

Competition day arrived with glorious sunshine, a few wispy clouds, and little wind to speak of. So, it was sou'westers away and out with the suncream. However, the downside of this fine day was having to shoot directly into the sun. Shooting commenced on time with a couple of ends of practice followed by the first Clout round of 36 arrows.







It proved to be a slow morning with everyone getting used to the arrow collection and scoring routine followed by a coordinated hunt for the (still) missing arrow after every end. As a result the lunch break was reduced to one hour – just enough time for some to dash to Morrisons and back!!

The afternoon session commenced with a couple of ends shooting at the life-size knight on horseback located at about 140m. Needless to say, the target face came home in much the same condition as it arrived, although to be fair, there were a couple of hits to the target – but horse and rider remained unscathed. Better luck next year! Jean Pierre was the next in line for 12 arrows apiece at about 110m which resulted in a little more success with a couple of kills and several injuries.







With the fun out of the way, the retirement of 3 archers and the arrival of another archer (who arrived late having got the start time wrong - even though he designed and printed the posters for the event – for which the leg pulling was merciless!) the afternoon clout round commenced.















Before heading to the results for the day we must extend our thanks to a few people. First a foremost is to Edward the landowner. We were only able to hold this competition through his generous offer of the use of his field. We must also thank Dave Sutton and Simon Hayes for the making the stile and also the magnificent targets they fabricated (both of which will last many years at the rate we manage to hit them).
